


GIVING THANKS

We also celebrated Dia de los Muertos (Day of the Dead), a Mexican/Latin American holiday to remember and honor loved ones who have passed away. The children made a craft using paint, crayons, and stickers.

ADVENTURES IN SCIENCE

The kiddos enjoy the virtual science lessons taught by Ms. Morgan of The WonderLab Museum of Science, Health, and Technology. One lesson explored the water cycle (evaporation, condensation, precipitation, and collection) and the different forms of water (liquid, solid, and gas). Another lesson taught us about composting. We read *Compost Stew: An A-Z Recipe for the Earth* by Mary McKenna Siddals. We learned how to start a compost pile, what's safe to include, and the benefits of composting.

We also had lots of fun learning about pumpkins. Ms. Brenda opened up a pumpkin, and we got to reach inside and feel the slimy flesh and seeds. Plus Ms. Annde gave each child a paper plate with pumpkin and seeds to explore using magnifying glasses. <u>View</u> photos.


